A new year awaits, inviting us to dedicate the very best of ourselves with the vocation to contribute to a society facing new challenges and which needs us more intensely than ever before.

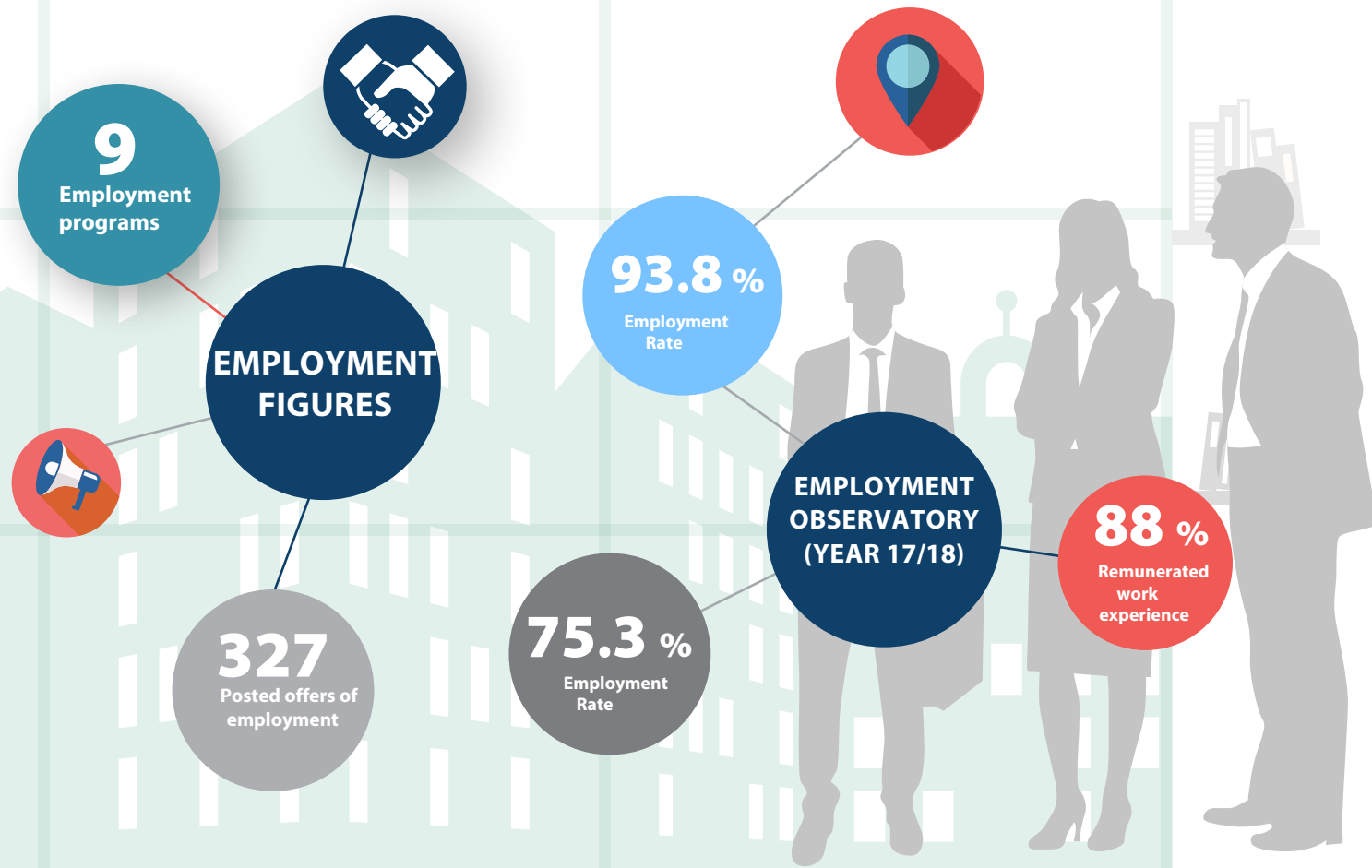

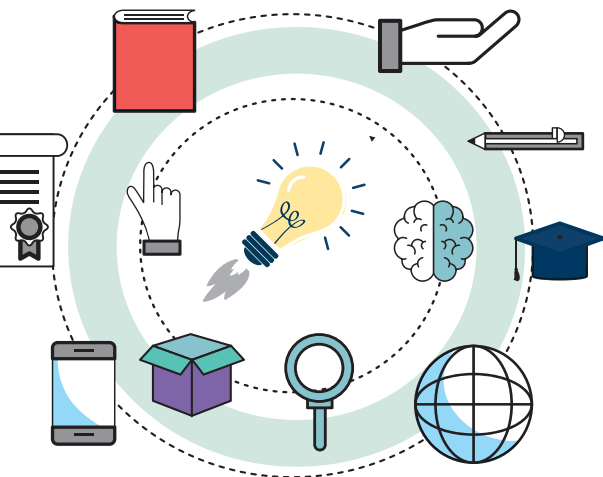
Scientific publications

A total of 189 papers were published in high impact journals (until June 2020).

Collaboration agreements

The UFV currently has 40 partnership agreements with various institutions, including the National Centre for Oncological Research (CNIO), the National Centre for Cardiovascular Research (CNIC), the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC), the Combined Unit for Cardiovascular Research, as well as the Ramon y Cajal Hospital, the 12 de Octubre Hospital and the Autonomous University of Madrid, among many others.





OTRI

1. Orientation for faculty members in presenting applications for the evaluation of ongoing research (sexennials) with 90% internal evaluations. There are 135 recognised faculty sexennials, in addition to new sexennials for transfer and research, making the UFV the private university in Madrid with the highest number of sexennials by 100 professors, according to the IUNE ranking.

2. Some 62 applications were made for external competitive convocations for public or private funding in 2019, with new agreements reached with companies in R&D projects. A new internal convocation was also established through which the OTRI assisted over 60 researchers in preparing their research agenda and planning their project presentations.

3. The licencing of patents was promoted through informative workshops about the utility of patents in scientific research, resulting in the licencing of two new patents, one in 2019 and the other in 2020.

4. The Scientific Culture Unit of the OTRI works to raise awareness of the research being conducted within the UFV Community. External dissemination included the coordination of Science Week and the European Night of Researchers as well as the latest edition of MIND ON promoting a culture of scientific research.

Library

The UFV Library has established a self-issue system for the rapid and effective circulation of books. During the confinement period, the Library continued to work in support of teachers and researchers, through the

collection, organisation and availability of some 40 academic publications.

International Doctoral School

There are currently 82 students enrolled in the Doctoral School: 64 in the Biotechnology, Medicine and Health Sciences program and 18 in the Humanities. The Doctoral program in Biotechnology, Medicine and Health Sciences successfully passed the certification process of the Madrid+D Knowledge Foundation. 4 doctoral theses were defended this year.

Postgraduate and Vocational Studies School

The School offers a wide range of programs in the areas of Juridical- Economic Sciences, Education, the Humanities, Biomedicine, Communication, Technology and Engineering as well as the UFV Business School. The school currently has 2,225 students enrolled in Masters programs.

Innovation & Entrepreneurship

Innovation Institute

Established seven years ago, the Innovation Institute is part of the Vice-rectorate for Innovation and Entrepreneurship. The principal objective of the Institute is to mobilise, promote and facilitate educational innovation to orient the university towards sciences and professions with a human focus, advancing a new culture of entrepreneurship in the service of society. Given the global obligation to bring teaching on-line, the Institute has taken the lead in adapting to the change, producing technological and educational content and participating, along with the other Vice-rectorates, in providing training and orientation to the UFV faculty.

Figures for the 2019/20 academic year

Concessions of Grants for Teaching Innovation 2020: 66 projects in the «Innova» and 14 projects in the «Consolida» modalities, with the participation of nine Teaching Communities.

The launch of new projects and events for the dissemination of Best Teaching Practices:

- The Epicentro Program in which various professors open their classrooms to their colleagues.
- InnoBar on university teaching with eight educational talks and the attendance of over fifty teachers.
- Brunch Method: a series of debates on emerging pedagogical trends.
- Creation of teaching content: educational videos created by students and teachers with the classroom lightboard and the publication of tutorials and videos of Best Practices and Teaching Communities.

Remote teaching: the creation of educational content in the form of videos and infographics to facilitate the transformation towards on-line, remote teaching.

- Pedagogical conversations with experts in educational innovation.

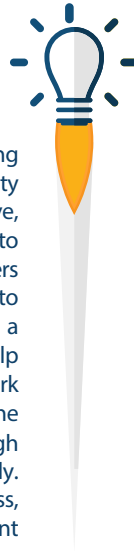

Some Training Activities of the Entrepreneurship Centre:


The Entrepreneurship Centre


The Centre has now been operating for three years, providing orientation and consulting services to the UFV Community from the initial steps of an idea to the launch of an innovative, intra-entrepreneurial or entrepreneurial project according to individual ideas, goals and objectives. The Centre offers practical, flexible and experiential support structured into itineraries based on the interest of each person, creating a UFV entrepreneurial road map. A group of experts help develop each project with an orientation team and a network of mentors, setting up meetings with agents in the entrepreneurial ecosystem, promoting *networking* through events and competitions locally, nationally and internationally. The Centre also works in the incubation process, accelerating projects towards the phases of investment and first sales. These activities increasingly benefit from the participation and collaboration of UFV faculties and degrees within the Entrepreneurship Framework Program of the UFV, proposed by the Vice-rector for Innovation and Entrepreneurship serving the entire UFV Community.

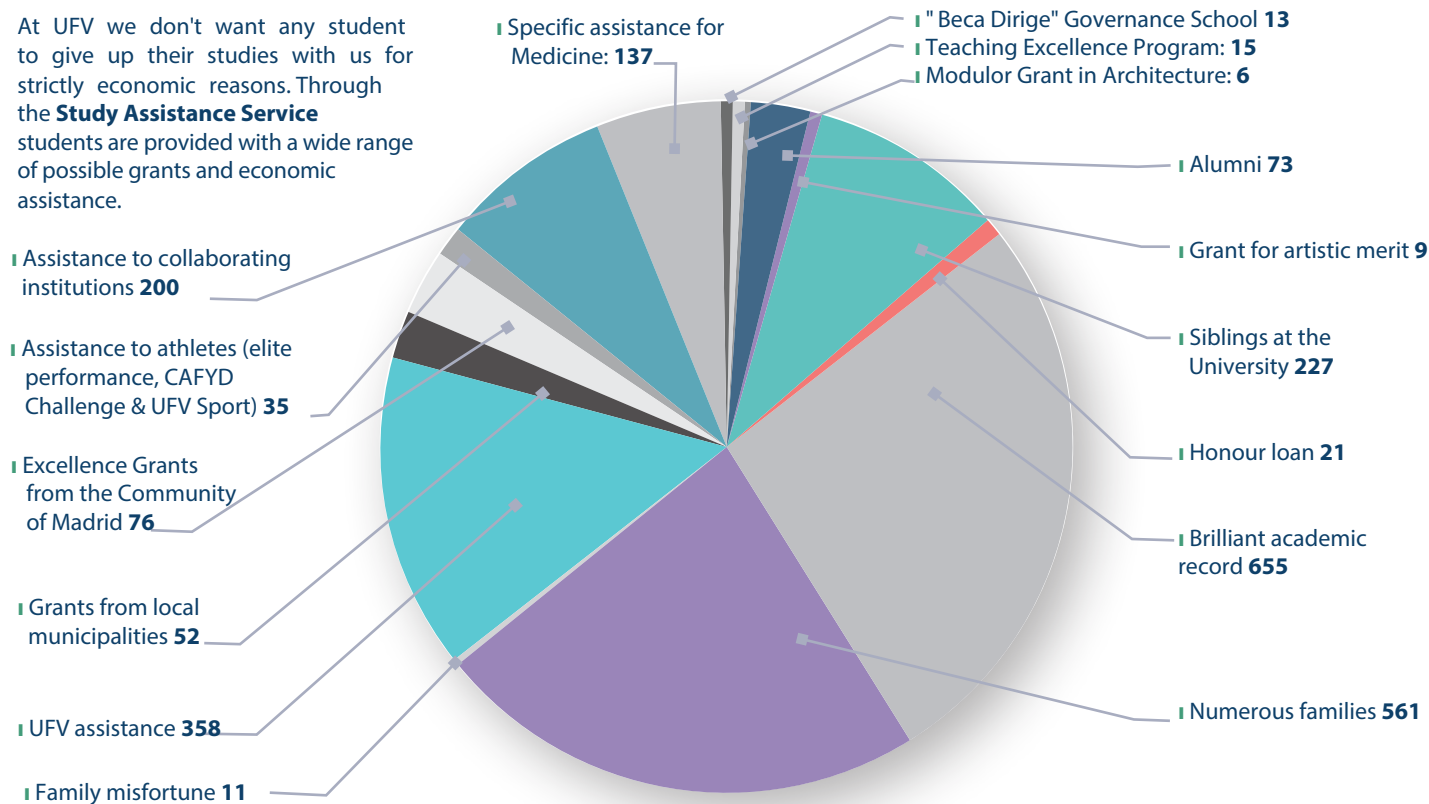

Quality and Organisational Transformation

The mission of the Vice-rectorate for Quality and Organisational Transformation is to oversee the dissemination of a culture of quality and best practices, effectiveness, efficiency and the functionality of services, projects and processes for the development of a management model centred on the person. It will also work to coordinate and accompany the Educational Community to generate and implement systems that facilitate management, evaluation and analysis of the results of the activities of the University. All of this based on a philosophy of constant learning and continuous improvement in service of the community and addressing the fundamentals.



The Vice-rectorate for Quality and Organisational Transformation is structured on three main axes:

1. Quality and Evaluation

- To give support to qualifications in the processes of the Internal Quality Guarantee System.
- Processes of Oversight and Renovation of Accreditation.
- Continuous improvement through information analysis.
- Maintaining the ISO Certification 9001:2008: Management, Library and Colegio Mayor.

2. Excellence

a. Centre of Excellence: a promotor and coordinator of initiatives that seek change and improvement at the UFV: Ambassadors, projects of the Strategic Plan and engagement with the University Community (Santo Tomás, PAS meetings, Aranjuez and faculty).

b. Active Listening Centre: to encourage and develop the virtue of listening in the university environment for the taking of decisions centred on the person; defining directives and establishing procedures to improve the quality of academics and services of the university in accordance with the UFV Mission.

3. Digital Transformation

The strategy was established at the Digital Transformation Committee and has been deployed through the Office of Digital Transformation which combines the following areas:



a. University Applications: To provide development assistance and support in the different learning environments, the production of audio-visual educational content as well as planning and technical audio-visual support for events.

b. User Support: To provide a multi-channel meeting point for the entire UFV Community, attending to inquiries and requests through a range of interconnected services and processes, that ensure effective solutions that meet the needs of the users.

c. Infrastructure: To give support to all areas of the University, as a key area for the digital and technological development of UFV through telecommunications, data networks, servers, systems, Cybersecurity and the collaborative Office 365 platform.

d. Management applications: To develop, integrate and maintain the *software* necessary to carry out the various activities of the University Community.

e. Digital evolution based on the vision of the UFV Connected Campus: cloud storage, connectivity, the creation of content and knowledge transfer, the profile of global talent, personalisation, applied artificial intelligence, new spaces for meeting/learning and optimising university resources.

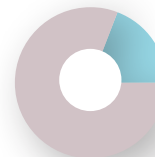

Executive Coaching and Consulting Centre (IDDI)



The **Executive Coaching and Consulting Centre** (IDDI) of the Francisco de Vitoria University is a centre specialised in executive training and business consulting for the transformation of the person, the team and the organisation as a whole.

We work hand in hand with companies to navigate complex economic environments using the IDDI Method, a practice that incorporates a new vision: a dialogical approach that allows organisations to develop meeting points and combine a binary calculus of profit/person. The IDDI has had unique insight into the business realities over the last 16 years, working in over 500 *in company* projects and in open programs with 900 business clients.

The IDDI is the only university institute specialised in organisational transformation that is centred on the person. With a panel of experts and investment in research, over the years the IDDI has been able to develop models for leadership, *coaching*, new methodologies and tools.

Areas of activity: programs for *executive education*, leadership and organisational transformation in an open, in company format with certifications in dialogical *coaching* for the top three levels of the company. The IDDI has conducted 25 editions of dialogical *coaching* in Spain, Mexico and Egypt as well as 17 editions of its Leadership Deployment Program (PDL).

Areas Research: Research unit: Irene Vázquez Chair of the Person-centred Company: model, tools and methodology for the person-centred company: pre-diagnostic, diagnostic and intervention. Role of change agents in an organisation. Version 2.0 of the Dialogical Coaching Method and Version of the Systemic Leadership as Change Agent.

Le Cordon Bleu Madrid



Founded in Paris in 1895, the Le Cordon Bleu culinary school arrived in Spain in 2011 after an alliance was established with the UFV to bring haute cuisine and Gastronomy into the University and the Postgraduate program. Thus the Haute Cuisine School of the Francisco de Vitoria University was born.

This year, the institution celebrated its 125th anniversary of its founding. Le Cordon Bleu international prepared a number of activities to celebrate its anniversary, such as, the launch of new programs and two international competitions.

The culinary school again participated in the international Madrid Fusión Gastronomy Congress with two workshops and an information booth. Additionally, and for the first time, one of the chefs of the school, Carlos Collado, offered a talk during the Congress on his research into the use of pressure cooking in haute cuisine.

The School concluded the last academic year with 869 students enrolled in its haute cuisine programs.

Integral Family Support Centre (CAIF)



The Centre offers **integral and specialised interventions** for all those in need, developing and improving their skills and abilities using a method of evaluation, assessment, intervention and follow-up. The Centre also conducts **therapeutic interventions** for children, adolescents and adults, attending individuals, families and couples according to their particular needs. The Centre has a team of clinical psychologists and health professionals specialised in addressing the needs of children and young people, families and couples with counselling and psychiatric services. This year services were extended to include learning therapy and nutrition, safeguarding the strictest confidentiality, while also consolidating its on-line Therapy services.

The Centre also provides training courses aimed at parents, professionals, students and the entire University Community.

As of May 2020, the CAIF conducted 2,574 sessions with 370 people, of whom, 248 were members of the UFV community and 122 were external. Nine training sessions were held in different institutions, attending 331 people (117 students, 76 parents, 59 teachers and 79 PAS/PROF of the UFV).

Francisco de Vitoria Higher Vocational Training Centre - CETYS

The UFV was the first university to incorporate the Advanced Degree Certificates in its academic offering on a University Campus through the Higher Vocational Training Centre (CETYS). It was also a pioneer in introducing dual training courses for subjects such as Diagnostic Imaging and Nuclear Medicine; Early Childhood Education; Administration and Finance; Sales Management and Commercial Spaces.

The courses for Advanced Degree Certificates have a duration of 2 years which can be accessed directly from secondary school. Since 2016, students can also access these courses after successfully completing the Intermediate Degree of the same subject. These courses are eminently practical, upon finishing their studies students obtain an Advanced Technician Certificate. After completing the course, students may access a university degree without the need to pass the entrance exam (EVAU) and to validate credits from various studies.

The **Colegio Mayor Francisco de Vitoria** opened its doors in 2006, and this year had 205 students in full-time occupancy. The Colegio Mayor offers UFV students who do not live in Madrid the opportunity to experience university life in full. The educational aspects are incorporated into excellent services on the Francisco de Vitoria University campus itself, which provides quality accommodation in private rooms (separated into different zones for men and women).

The students of the Colegio Mayor receive support from teachers providing mentoring and individual tutorials.

During the 2019/2020 academic years, the Colegio Mayor became a member of the Asociación de Colegios Mayores de Madrid and established a collaboration agreement for student exchanges with the Colegio Mayor Anáhuac Puebla (México).

In addition, the Colegio Mayor Francisco de Vitoria has participated in various international activities organised by the EuCA (European University College Association).

UFV International Business School



Founded in 2014, the UFV International Business School is an institution dedicated to executive development, offering an educational experience that is both authentic and transformative, providing excellent training that is practical, innovative and socially responsible.

The Academic Offer of the UFV-IBS is oriented towards the training of executives seeking to further develop their career in business, finance or international trade. The School provides professionals and executives with the ability to drive and lead a change in society through the positive transformation of the company, developing new and innovative management techniques in the leadership of teams and organisations.

The UFV-IBS teaches creative and competitive solutions based on a ethic of effort, trust, community and commitment.

The UFV International Business School has a faculty of expert professors and professionals with extensive experience in the business world, thus facilitating the transmission of practical skills and knowledge while providing students with guidance and support in their educational and professional development.

The School makes use of interactive methodologies such as simulators, integrated sessions and creative case studies that encourage students to find their vocation and develop the executive skills and competences.

Altius Francisco de Vitoria Foundation



This is the Foundation of the UFV and a complement to its mission in the development of projects to promote social actions in favour of the most vulnerable in our society. The Foundation works to support individuals and families at risk of social exclusion due to unemployment, improving their social conditions and job skills to enter the labour market.

Another of the Foundation's activities is the «1 Kilo of Help» program which, for over 18 years, has been channelling the help of people who purchase one of their donation cards in supermarkets throughout Spain. The UFV collaborates with the Altius Foundation through various initiatives, especially the "Solidarity Pay" for employees who wish to give their support to projects of the Foundation.

UFV Sports Centre



Inaugurated three years ago, the **UFV Sports Centre** has become one of the most important assets of the Francisco de Vitoria University.

With over 1,800 members, and with approximately 350 students enrolled in the Padel and Swimming Schools, the UFV Sports Centre has become the epicenter of two important projects for the Francisco de Vitoria University: the UFV Sports Project and the Healthy Campus Project, leading many elite athletes from all disciplines to choose our facilities to pursue their sports training programs.

The UFV Sports Centre has become the official site for training and competitions for a growing number of teams, leagues, schools and sports clubs as well as a growing number of sports events and competitions.

The **Exercise Physiology Laboratory**, managed within the Degree in Physical Activity and Sports Sciences, has been intensely active during this academic year, becoming a reference for studies, research and testing among both students and faculty.

The **Physiotherapy Clinic**, managed within the Degree in Physiotherapy, began to provide service this academic year, with two medical clinics providing treatment to patients.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 crisis the UFV Sports Centre was unable to offer its services presentially. As with all the other university services, these were available on-line via the social media accounts of the instructors: guided classes, training, child workshops and recommended activities during confinement to encourage the practice of sports and other physical activities among users.

Motor & Sport Institute



Thanks to the collaboration agreement between the Motor & Sport Institute and the Francisco de Vitoria University, the Advanced Polytechnical School is located at the MSI Centre, offering two degrees: the traditional Degree in Industrial Systems Engineering, with specialisations in Automotive science, Industrial Organisation and Industrial Technologies; a second degree, particularly current and in demand, is offered in Engineering in Connected Industry.

The Motor & Sport Institute is an advanced centre entirely dedicated to automotive engineering and elite sports, aiming to mark an inflection point in the automotive world inside Spain and beyond. Located in Alcorcon, Madrid, with facilities covering some 12,000 m², the MSI is one of the finest high technology facilities in Europe and, uniquely, is the only facility of its type that integrates the areas of motor sports and the automotive industry. That is, academic and technical instruction, physical and psychological training for drivers and hands-on, practical sports training in a single location.

The four floors of the MSI combine university classrooms, workshops for advanced component manufacturing, calculation and design studios, chassis, motor and aerodynamics testing areas,

a biomechanics and driver development centre, driving and eSport simulators, etc. The centre also has a spectacular exhibition hall, housing the private race car collection Teo Martin, promoter of the MSI.

The Motor & Sport Institute provides a unique and comprehensive service with the most advanced technologies and latest generation of equipment which, in line with the UFV commitment to excellence, permits our students to acquire the high level of technical training the sector demands.
